

From Denmark, Cert 18, runtime 1hr 56 mins



Rama, a novelist, attends the trial of Laurence Coly, accused of murdering her 15 month-old child. Both women are Senegalese, both are academic, but Laurence is continually put down while Rama is accepted. A fascinating courtroom drama exploring the difference and similarity between the two.
